Malaysia's Wake-Up-Call Dilemmas: In Three Parts

Part 2

Prologue

"Whoever doesn't miss the Soviet Union doesn't have a heart. Whoever wants it back doesn't have a brain."

If we think and meditate enough, we will conclude that President Putin's wisdom as quoted above applies to Malaysia without any need for qualification whatsoever.

Why?

President grew up and was part of the Soviet Union' system of government. The Reality

- 22 June 1941, 99 of 190 German divisions, including fourteen panzer divisions and ten motorized divisions, were deployed against the Soviet Union from the Baltic to the Black Sea.
- The Germans had 59 divisions spread over Western Europe from the Low Countries to the Atlantic and Mediterranean coasts of France; but approximately half of this number was static, and the remainder included only 10 armoured or motorized divisions.
- In WWII, in the Russia war theatre alone, the Germans ultimately allotted almost 150 divisions containing a total of about 3,000,000 (3 Million) men. Among these were 19 panzer divisions, and in total, the "Barbarossa" force had about 3,000 tanks, 7,000 artillery pieces, and 2,500 aircraft.
- How many German divisions were at Normandy? It was the main US offensive. The Germans could field only seven weakened infantry and parachute divisions, supported by 2nd SS Das Reich, Panzer Lehr (re-located from the Caen sector) and the remnants of 17th SS Panzer-grenadier Division.

- What nation did Germany fear most? Russia of the Soviet Union. A
 Communist country was one thing; the other thing that scared the
 Germans so much was the incredible size of Russia. Their armies were
 not the same as the French, the Belgians or any of the other nations
 they faced in Europe.
- What was the deadliest battle on the Eastern Front? Stalingrad was one
 of the most decisive battles on the Eastern Front in the Second
 World War. The Soviet Union inflicted a catastrophic defeat on the
 German Army in and around this strategically important city on the Volga
 River, which bore the name of the Soviet dictator, Josef Stalin.
- Who fought the Germans the most? Soviet Union: all those who studied history should know this the Soviet Union inflicted 80% of all German casualties. She mobilized more soldiers than the USA, UK, France, and Italy combined, and also suffered the most losses losing 20 million of her own people.

Now do you understand why President Putin said:

"Whoever doesn't miss the Soviet Union doesn't have a heart ..."

Soviet Union's heart was literally bleeding from the unprecedented sacrifice of the entire nation in defeating Nazi Germany. That was the proud and great history of the Soviet Union – WWII was rightly referred to as the Great Patriotic War. In 1990, it was conceded by the West that 26-27 million Russians died in this war. - The Eleventh Malaysia Plan, 2016-2020
