The Bargains You Have To Make

I reacted strongly, 2 articles ago, to most of Trump's appointments. Now I'm seeing it somewhat differently. There was no path to the presidency for Trump without unbridled support for Zionism. But, Trump inherits a different world than in 2016, a world where Zionism will no be able to sustain Israeli dominance in the Middle East. Trump sees it, and being a man averse to war, he will call the shots, not his appointees or Netanyahu.

Is Trump conducting a master plan? He is not—instead he's playing realpolitik, doing what he has to do to control outcome. Trump's *art of the deal*, requires that he appear unpredictably dangerous. Most of his picks do that—repaying his debt to the Adelsons.

Trump's appointments fall into 3 categories: unquestionable support for Israel, unquestionable support for Trump, and, for more important appointments—both. Some appointments are so wildly unpopular with elites that appointees being portrayed, must not be recognizable, even to themselves. As with his best appointment, Tulsi Gabbard.

My new friend Brad will not agree. He sees Tulsi as hugely unqualified, and, if I can speak for him—a Putin asset. As a consequence—Tulsi may be in the traitor category.

But Brad's wrong—Tulsi is a change in the culture who could be instrumental in achieving peace. Consider the qualified: Hillary/Clapper. Both are bought and sold agents of the war machine, while Tulsi is an ethical, patriotic American who will present the President with facts, each morning, to make decisions—facts uncolored by lies.
